## M.A. Criminal Justice Program

The program requires 30 credits of course work with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0. The 30 credits include 9 credits of core courses, 12 credits of criminal justice electives, and 9 credits of electives from the Graduate School-Camden, Law School-Camden, or others as approved by the graduate director.
